0293	Adairsville, City of CDBG Multi Purpose Center	\$500,000	Proposes construction of a 3,250 square foot expansion at the existing site of the North Bartow Community Services facility in the City of Adairsville. The current facility serves low- to moderate-income persons in a variety of ways: energy assistance, health fairs, and a food pantry, among others. Four hundred fifty-six people will benefit, of whom 410 or 90 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0315	Adel, City of CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$368,310	Proposes drainage improvements to address localized flooding and drainage issues. The project activities will benefit 95 people, of whom 80 or 84 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0285	Alamo, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$350,000	Proposes to made sewer improvements in the southern portion of the city in order to replace malfunctioning septic tanks, benefiting 50 people, of whom 42 or 84 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.

0263	Bacon County CDBG Senior Center	\$340,952	Proposes renovation of the old Elementary School building to provide adequate space for various programs for senior citizens, benefiting 387 people, all considered low- to moderate-income.
0186	Baldwin County CDBG Water Improvements	\$378,883	Proposes installation of water improvements, including 5,124 linear feet of 6 inch water mains, in a low- to moderate-income target area. Improvements will serve 128 people, of whom 97 or 76 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0190	Barnesville, City of CDBG Multi Infrastructure Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to replace old transite water distribution lines, install household connections, upgrade fire protection, and install sidewalk improvements for the residents of the Akins Street Target Area. The target area improvements will serve 356 people, of whom 316 or 89 percent are low- to moderate- income.
0268	Blairsville, City of CDBG Water/Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes replacement of outdated water and sewer infrastructure in the southwestern portion of the city, benefiting 320 people, of whom 273 or 85 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0342	Buena Vista, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$480,868	Proposes pubic sewer services to 34 households in order to address heath and safety issues, benefiting 102 people, of whom 98 or 96 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0204	Cairo, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes water distribution improvements in a neighborhood of 413 people, of whom 378 or 92 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens. The City will provide \$76,780 in additional support for the project.



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0304	Calhoun, City of CDBG Multi Activity Program	\$800,000	Proposes multi-activity program providing water and sanitary sewer improvements and housing rehabilitation or reconstruction assistance to four homeowners, benefiting 110 people, of whom 92 or 84 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0203	Camilla, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$500,000	Project proposes water distribution system improvements in the Baggs Ferry Road area, a neighborhood of 440 people, of whom 407 or 93 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens. The City is providing \$65,284 in local matching support.
0252	Cecil, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes sewer improvements in the eastern section of the city to replace inoperable septic systems, benefiting 81 people, of whom 76 or 94 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0251	Colquitt County CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$445,081	Proposes street and drainage improvements in the Sam Rentz Road/Hyde Lane neighborhood, benefiting 60 people, of whom 55 or 92 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0192	Concord, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to rehabilitate failing sewer lines in the Hilltop Community. The improvements will serve 229 people, of whom 217 or 95 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.

0333	Darien, City of CDBG Multi Activity Program	\$800,000	Proposed improvements in the Old River Road area include new water mains and fire hydrants, street and drainage facilities, acquisition and clearance of dilapidated structures, and housing rehabilitation, serving 65 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0257	Early County CDBG Health Center	\$499,158	Proposes improvements to and expansion of the county's public health facility to address efficient delivery of patient care, benefiting 5,772 people, of whom 4,242 or 74 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0249	Edison, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes sewer improvements to include 20,600 linear feet of sewer repairs and inspections throughout the city, benefiting 1,049 people, of whom 868 or 83 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.

0214	Gordon County CDBG Boys and Girls Club	\$500,000	Proposes to acquire and renovate a facility to be used as a boy's and girl's club. The project will benefit 225 people, of whom 193 or 86 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0189	Griffin, City of CDBG Multi Infrastructure Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to replace old transite water distribution lines, install household connections, and upgrade fire protection for the residents of the Thomaston Mills Target Area. The city will also use CDBG funds to replace a sewer force main that serves the area. Facilities will serve 339 people, of whom 332 or 98 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0250	Guyton, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to install a sewer collection system and demolish abandoned septic tanks in the Sugar Hill community, benefiting 65 people, of whom 61 or 94 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0334	Hagan, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to connect 300 families to the city's new sewage system. Eight hundred sixty-five people will benefit, of whom 675 or 78 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0269	Hancock County CDBG Workforce Development Center	\$500,000	Proposes to construct a Commercial Truck Driving Training Facility in partnership with Sandersville Technical College, benefiting 76 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0195	Harlem, City of CDBG Senior Center	\$500,000	Proposes to build a 4,680 foot senior center in the Harlem City Park to serve 100 senior citizens.
0256	Hazlehurst, City of CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes drainage improvements to the Bird Subdivision, benefiting 106 people, of whom 102 or 96 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.



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0188	Heard County CDBG Street Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to pave 2.3 miles of dirt roads in the southeastern portion of the county known as the Country Side Estates Community. The improvements will serve 167 people, of whom 160 or 96 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0314	Irwin County CDBG Water Improvements	\$463,479	Proposes replacement of undersized, degraded water mains with 20,260 linear feet of 6" PVC pipe and the installation of fire hydrants to address fire protection and water quality concerns, benefiting 145 people in the Mystic community, of whom 143 or 99 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0196	Jackson County CDBG Senior Center	\$500,000	Proposes to renovate and expand the County's existing twenty-seven-year-old senior citizens facility. Two hundred and six senior citizens will benefit from the improvements.
0260	Jefferson County CDBG Neighborhood Facilities	\$500,000	Proposes to construct a recreation facility in order to provide indoor recreation, after school programs, and educational opportunities, benefiting 309 people, of whom 222 or 72 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0247	Long County CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes street and drainage improvements in the Wilkinson Road area, benefiting 104 people, of whom 81 or 78 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0237	Lumpkin, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$496,213	Proposes to replace its water treatment plant and over 9,500 linear feet of outdated cast iron pipe to address health and safety and maintenance issues, benefiting 1,353 people, of whom 1,094 or 81 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0262	Lyons, City of CDBG Street Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes street and drainage improvements in the northwest quadrant of the city in order to address health and safety issues associated with poor road conditions and local flooding, benefiting 58 people, of whom 54 or 93 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0358	Manchester, City of CDBG Multi Activity Program	\$800,000	Proposes comprehensive program to acquire and clear dilapidated structures, provide rehabilitation and reconstruction assistance to homeowners, and make street and drainage improvements. The activities will address 12 units and benefit 56 people, of whom 45 or 80 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0248	McIntosh County CDBG Water Improvements	\$499,968	Proposes 8" and 6" water lines in the Smith Road area in order to replace inadequate private wells and 2" and 4" lines, benefiting 149 people, of whom 130 or 87 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0205	Meigs, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes rehabilitation of the sewer collection system in northwest Meigs to eliminate sewer backups into homes and overflowing manholes. The City will provide \$33,635 in support for the project. The renovated facilities will serve 319 people, of whom 307 or 96 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.



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0207	Pelham, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes the rehabilitation of an existing, aged sewer collection system in northwest Pelham to correct overflow conditions and to comply with an EPD consent order. The City is providing \$45,694 in additional funds. The project will benefit 559 people, of whom 529 or 95 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0245	Perry, City of CDBG Health Center	\$500,000	Proposes construction of a new facility to provide long-term treatment for women with substance addictions, benefiting 76 people, of whom 57 or 75 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0216	Polk County CDBG Domestic Violence Shelter	\$500,000	Proposes the construction of a battered women's shelter to benefit 141 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income.
0243	Randolph County CDBG Neighborhood Facilities	\$500,000	Proposes to build a 3,500 square foot facility to house the county's Neighborhood Services Center, benefiting 500 people, of whom 493 or 99 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0335	Ray City, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes improvements to the city's water pollution control plant and sewage collection system to correct deficiencies that have resulted in EPD permit violations and backup of sewage into people's homes. Seven hundred forty-six people will benefit, of whom 576 or 77 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0266	Riceboro, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes installing a sewage collection system and demolishing septic tanks in the Barrington Ferry Road area, benefiting 57 people, of whom 54 or 95 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0215	Sasser, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$300,000	Proposes to construct a 450-gallon-per-minute well to augment the city's main well. Improvements will benefit 269 people, of whom 202 or 75 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0193	Seminole County CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes street and drainage improvements on approximately one mile of dirt road in the Happy Hollow neighborhood. Seventy-six people will benefit, of whom 72 or 95 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0236	Shellman, City of CDBG Housing Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to rehabilitate seven stick built housing units and one manufactured housing unit, reconstruct two stick built houses and replace three manufactured housing units with stick built homes, and provide relocation assistance to one family. 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0357	Sumter County CDBG Health Center	\$500,000	Proposes renovation of an existing building in order to house the county's health department, providing a 17,400 square foot facility to provide health care services to 7,241 people, of whom 6,300 or 87 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0246	Swainsboro, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes sewer improvements in the northwest section of the city to address inflow/infiltration problems that are leading to health and safety concerns. The activities will benefit 164 people, of whom 143 or 87 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0199	Sycamore, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$500,000	Project proposes water distribution system improvements in East Sycamore that will benefit 303 people, of whom 229 or 76 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens. The City is providing \$139,000 in matching support.
0271	Tennille, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$443,761	Proposes water improvements in a city target area to address sanitary water supply, fire protection, and water pressure needs. The facilities will benefit 142 people, of whom 134 are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0197	Tifton, City of CDBG Water/Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes water and sewer system improvements in a large neighborhood consisting of 845 people, of whom 797 or 94 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens. The City will provide \$221,000 in local matching support for the project.
0341	Unadilla, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$363,623	Proposes the installation of public sewer collection infrastructure to support 31 households, benefiting 106 people, of whom 103 or 97 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0253	Vidalia, City of CDBG Multi Infrastructure Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes water and sewer and street and drainage improvements in the north central section of the city to address inoperable septic tanks, fire protection, yard flooding, and poor street conditions, benefiting 58 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0343	Vienna, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$413,476	Proposes installation of sewer collection lines and household service connections in order to replace failing septic tanks, benefiting 148 people, of whom 124 or 84 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0291	Ware County CDBG Street Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to pave 1.5 miles of dirt roadways in the Emerson Park area, benefiting 73 people, of whom 55 or 75 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.

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0259	Washington, City of CDBG Multi Activity Program	\$800,000	Proposes complete site redevelopment in the Rusher Street Target Area in order to eliminate slum and blight. Activities will include acquisition and re-platting, relocation assistance, clearance and demolition, and infrastructure improvements. Forty-seven people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0359	Webster County CDBG Street Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes street improvements to a rural subdivision, Wildwood Estates, benefiting 116 people, of whom 107 or 92 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0241	Whigham, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$459,508	Proposes to replace outdated cast iron water lines to address health and safety issues facing the city's drinking water. The activities will benefit 256 people, of whom 218 or 85 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0330	Willacoochee, City of CDBG Multi Infrastructure Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to provide sewer collection lines and street and drainage improvements in the Haines Subdivision in order to address malfunctioning septic tanks and standing water, benefiting 37 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0209	Brunswick, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes downpayment assistance and developer subsidies to assist 15 low income families with the purchase of homes in the City. Incentives will be provided to families seeking homes in designated revitalization areas.
0274	Colquitt, City of CHIP Revitalization Area Strategy (CHIP)	\$200,000	Proposes to assist homeowners in the City's proposed Revitalization Area with rehabilitation and reconstruction assistance, benefiting 15 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens. Five units will be addressed.
0231	Dalton, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes to assist nine homeowners with the rehabilitation of their homes. CHIP assistance will be limited to households earning 50 percent of the area median income or less, giving priority to those with earnings at or below 30 percent of the area median income. Twenty-seven low income people will benefit.
0325	Darien, City of CHIP Revitalization Area Strategy (CHIP)	\$200,000	Proposes construction of two new homes on city-owned lots in the Old River Road Revitalization Area for low-income persons . Assistance will include help with downpayment costs and closing costs. Six people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0326	Darien, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes a citywide housing assistance program, including rehabilitation assistance for seven owner-occupied private properties. Twenty-two people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0327	Fitzgerald, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes a citywide housing assistance program, including downpayment and closing cost assistance for 20 households. Seventy-four people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.



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0297	Floyd County CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes housing assistance program, including downpayment and closing cost assistance for 30 first-time homebuyers in collaboration with the City of Rome and the Northwest Georgia Housing Authority. Seventy-five people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0222	Gainesville, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes a citywide rehabilitation and downpayment assistance program that will assist six homeowners and 14 homebuyers. Ninety people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0244	Griffin, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes citywide homebuyer assistance program to assist 20 families with downpayment and closing costs in order to make homeownership possible. The activities will benefit 52 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0284	Hall County CHIP Revitalization Area Strategy (CHIP)	\$198,792	Proposes housing rehabilitation assistance program, providing loans and project management in the DCA-designated Revitalization Area to eight families. Eighteen people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0292	Hall County CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$298,725	Proposes a downpayment assistance program for county residents, providing up to \$7,500 in assistance to eligible families. Loans are forgivable over five years and participants must attend homebuyer education classes. One hundred fifteen people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0230	McDuffie County CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$290,104	Proposes to assist five homeowners with the rehabilitation of their homes. CHIP assistance will be limited to households earning 50 percent of the area median income or less, giving priority to those with earnings at or below 30 percent of the area median income. Fifteen low income people in the Strawberry Hill and Pitts Street areas will benefit.
0229	Thomson, City of CHIP Revitalization Area Strategy (CHIP)	\$167,590	Proposes to assist three homeowners with the rehabilitation of their homes. Priority will be given to families that are earning less than 30 percent of the area median income and live in the Strawberry Hill and Pitts Street areas.
0261	Tift County CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes a downpayment assistance program for 20 low- to moderate-income families in the Phillipsburg/Unionville community, benefiting 60 people and creating a \$1.5 million impact on the local economy.
0273	Washington, City of CHIP Revitalization Area Strategy (CHIP)	\$200,000	Proposes rehabilitating four stick built housing units in the Rusher Street Target Area, benefiting nine low- to moderate-income citizens.
