0428	Alma, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes sewer Improvements to include pipe bursting, T-service connections, PVC sewer mains, and manhole rehabilitation and manhole construction, benefiting 153 people of whom 99 percent are low- to moderate-income.
0461	Arabi, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$468,144	City of Arabi Water System Improvements. Proposes replacing 40+ year old ductile iron water mains with new 6 inch c-900 PVC water mains to alleviate the city of many problems associated with their old, worn and brittle ductile iron water mains.
0540	Argyle, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$475,118	Proposes citywide water distribution improvements, benefiting 214 people, of whom 166 or 78 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens. The City will provide \$15,000 in local matching support for the project.
0372	Ashburn, City of CDBG Multi Infrastructure Improvements	\$500,000	Project proposes water distribution, sewer collection, street and drainage improvements in a low/mod income neighborhood of 285 persons, 94% of whom are low/mod income. The City of Ashburn is providing \$84,050 in local support for the project.
0544	Atkinson County CDBG Health Center	\$458,875	Proposes the renovation and expansion of the Atkinson County Health Department in Pearson, GA to serve Atkinson County citizens. It will improve existing space and will benefit 2,525 people of whom 1,859, or 74 percent are low- to moderate-income.
0378	Baconton, City of CDBG Drainage Improvements	\$499,964	Northwest Baconton Storm Drainage Improvements - Project proposes storm drainage improvements in a low- and moderate-income neighborhood of 148 persons. The City is providing \$60,000 in matching support.
0550	Ben Hill County CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Ben Hill County-Wide Housing Assistance Program - To provide down payment/closing cost assistance to 11 low and moderate income households. Provide Rehab Assistance for 4 low and moderate income owner-occupied private properties. 45 persons of whom 100% are low and moderate income will benefit.
0553	Berrien County CDBG Boys and Girls Club	\$500,000	Proposes to construct a 5,072 square foot Boys and Girls Club in Nashville, GA to serve 154 children/youth of whom 142 or 92% are low- to moderate- income.



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0436	Blakely, City of CDBG Head Start Facility	\$500,000	Project proposes the construction of a Head Start Facility for the Blakely/Early County Head Start Program. The existing facility does not have sufficient space. The unit has multiple noncompliant health and safety issues that subject the 74 children from low and moderate income families to risk.
0371	Boston, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes rehabilitation of the sewer collection system in the West Boston neighborhood to eliminate sewer infiltration and inflow and overflowing manholes. The City will provide \$99,858 in support for the project. The renovated facilities will serve 137 people, of whom 104 or 76 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0445	Canon, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to upgrade water system infrastructure and improve fire protection to serve 899 residents, 737 (82%) of whom are low- to moderate-income persons.
0384	Carrollton, City of CDBG Health Center	\$500,000	Proposes to construct a neighborhood health care clinic and counseling center for low- to moderate- income families. The counseling center will provide housing and credit counseling, job search assistance, and adult literacy services. Three hundred fifty low- to moderate- income people will benefit from the improvements.
0522	Cartersville, City of CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to construct in North Towne (downtown area) a new storm water capture and conveyance system to serve 78 beneficiaries, 64 of whom are low- to moderate-income persons (82.05%). Project activities will alleviate flooding and other safety hazards that currently impact the neighborhood.
0495	Cartersville, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes in collaboration with the Etowah Area Consolidated Housing Authority, to provide downpayment and closing assistant up to a maximum of \$10,000 per household to 26 low income households and a total of 104 low -to moderate income persons (100%).
0455	Chickamauga, City of CDBG Water/Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to replace water and sewer infrastructure in the eastern and southern parts of the Crystal Springs Mill Village. Proposed improvements will benefit 206 people, 159 or 77% are low- to moderate-income persons.
0521	Cochran, City of CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$465,998	Proposes street and drainage improvements to both Mary Street and Clark Street, benefiting 71 people, of whom 61 or 86 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.



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0541	Coffee County CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes street and drainage improvements on approximately 0.934 miles of dirt road in the Oak Park neighborhood. One hundred thirty-two people will benefit, of whom 119 or 90 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens. The County will provide \$282,080 in cash matching support for the project.
0496	Colquitt, City of CDBG Multi Activity Program	\$703,378	Proposes multi-activity program for the revitalization of Middle Street to include sewer, water, street and drainage improvements, as well as housing improvements to include acquisition, clearance and rehabilitation of 7 units. Project will improve the quality of life for 41 low- to moderate-income persons.
0437	Damascus, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$396,057	Proposes water system improvement project, benefiting 231 residents, 199 (86.15%) are low/mod income.
0381	Donalsonville, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$500,000	Project proposes water distribution system improvements in Southeast Donalsonville that will benefit 523 people, of whom 409 or 78 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens. The City is committing \$80,748 as support for the project.
0475	Dooly County CDBG Housing Improvements	\$488,047	Proposes a countywide housing assistance program, including rehabilitation assistance for four and reconstruction of three homeowners, benefiting 20 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0470	Dooly County CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes housing assistance program, including rehabilitation assistance for five owner-occupied private properties and reconstruction assistance to four homeowners. Twenty-four people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0483	Douglas, City of CDBG Housing Improvements	\$210,000	Proposes a citywide down-payment assistance and closing cost program that will benefit 50 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0484	Douglas, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$281,605	Proposes a citywide housing assistance program, including rehabilitation assistance of ten owner-occupied site built and reconstruction assistance of one owner-occupied site built private properties, benefiting 29 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.



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0403	Douglasville, City of CDBG Boys and Girls Club	\$500,000	Proposes to expand the existing Boys & Girls Club building with the addition of a teen center. Six hundred fifty-three kids will benefit, of whom 554 or 85 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0500	Eastman, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes construction of sewer improvements, benefiting 231 people, of whom 228 or 99 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0414	Ellijay, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes rehabilitation of sewer lines benefiting 88 people, of whom 83 or 94 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0536	Greenville, City of CDBG Housing Improvements	\$500,000	Application proposes reconstruction of six housing units and acquisition and clearance of 5 dilapidated, vacant units. Twenty-eight persons, all of whom are very low income, will benefit
0504	Griffin, City of CDBG Water/Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Project proposes water distribution system improvements and replacement of a sewer force main and sewage collection lines that will benefit 168 people, of whom 151 or 90 percent are low- to moderate- income citizens.
0386	Hall County CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes to provide downpayment assistance in amounts up to \$7,500 to 53 low- to moderate-income families. One hundred thirty-two people are expected to benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income.
0456	Hart County CDBG Water Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to construct new water lines, service connections and fire protection improvements in the Rocky Ford-Parkertown Area to benefit an estimated 283 people, 221 (78 percent) of whom qualify as low- and moderate- income.
0552	Homeland, City of CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$269,377	Proposes street and drainage improvements on approximately 0.519 mile of dirt road in two target areas. Fifty-three people will benefit, of whom 46 or 86.8 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens. The City is providing \$20,000 in cash and \$25,155 in-kind in matching support.
0549	Homerville, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes sewer improvements in the northeast quadrant of the city to address sewer line, manhole, and (1) lift station rehabilitation. The activities will benefit 379 people, of whom 343 or 90 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.



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0449	LaGrange, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Citywide homeowner rehabilitation program. A minimum of 12 units to be rehabilitation citywide for low-income homeowners benefiting a total of 30 persons, all of whom are members of low-income households.
0369	Leesburg, City of CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	The project proposes storm drainage improvements to relieve flooding conditions impacting 92 low/mod income residents of a rent subsidized apartment complex, Stonegate Manor Apartments, that has had units flooded over the last few years.
0548	Lowndes County CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes countywide housing assistance program to provide rehab assistance to 2 homeowners and down-payment assistance to 16 homebuyers. Forty-eight low- to moderate-income people will benefit
0471	Marshallville, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Provide rehab to 5 houses and reconstruction to 4 houses helping 23 low/mod people
0477	McIntyre, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes housing assistance program, including rehabilitation assistance for five and reconstruction assistance for eight homeowners. Thirty-seven people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0528	Milan, City of CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$497,761	Proposes to provide street and drainage improvements in 2 areas to benefit 55 people, 48 (87%) are low/mod income. Application also proposes to provide water improvements to benefit 37 people, 35 of whom are low/mod (95%) income.
0476	Milledgeville, City of CDBG Housing Improvements	\$453,918	Proposes housing assistance program, including rehabilitation assistance for three homeowners and reconstruction assistance for three homeowners. Acquire and clear seven housing units. Thirteen people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0412	Millen, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Millen proposes sewer improvements in the Knox Home target area to benefit 111 people, 90 of whom (81.08%) are low- to moderate-income.
0508	Molena, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes water improvements to filter out uranium contamination and increase water pressure. This will benefit 420 people, 329 (78.33%) are low/mod.



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0406	Monroe, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to replace failing sewer infrastructure in the target area to stop raw sewage from flowing up through manholes and backing up into houses. The project will benefit 924 people, 913 of whom (98.81%) are low- to moderate- income.
0366	Moultrie, City of CDBG Drainage Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes storm water infrastructure to correct flooding conditions and assist 101 people, 85 of which (84.16%) are low- to moderate-income.
0453	Ocilla, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$400,775	Proposes to replace aging sewer lines and resurface streets in the target area. This will help 254 people, 237 of whom (93.31%) are low/mod income.
0524	Pierce County CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$497,711	Proposes to pave 1.13 miles of dirt streets along with providing flood and drainage improvements within an area of the county to eliminate potential threats to the health and safety of 187 persons, of whom 140 or 75 percent are low- and moderate-income.
0501	Pineview, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$462,808	Proposes to replace cast iron and galvanized water lines that date back to 1956 with PVC pipes. These water lines are deteriorated and do not provide adequate water pressure for drinking or fire suppression. The project will benefit 152 persons, 130 (86%) of whom are low- to moderate-income.
0494	Portal, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$489,840	Proposes sewer system improvements benefiting 93 people, of whom 88 or 95 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0546	Quitman, City of CDBG Multi Activity Program	\$800,000	Proposes water, sewer, street and drainage, and rehabilitation assistance that will assist six homeowners. Thirty-one people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0392	Randolph County CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$465,049	Phase 2 Benevolence Community & Drainage Improvements-- The proposed project will solve the accessibility and flooding problems occurring in the Benevolence Community. The project will provide 37 people of whom 86.5% are low- to moderate-income with all weather access to and from their homes.
0472	Randolph County CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes to a county wide program including the towns of Morris, Coleman & Benevolence and in the unincorporated areas of Randolph County. Proposes to provide rehab assistance to 5, provide reconstruction assistance to 3 and provide down payment assistance to 1 low/mod. family. 24 persons to benefit.



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0452	Reynolds, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes replacing sewer lines that are antiquated, infiltrated by roots, and in some places, are partially collapsing. This creates sewage back-up in peoples' homes and yards. Seventy-six people will benefit of whom 65 or 86 percent are low- to moderate-income.
0396	Richland, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to upgrade existing water system. CDBG funds will be used to replace asbestos cement water lines which were not identified in previous grant/loan applications. This will directly benefit 1,794 persons, 95% are low- to moderate-income.
0410	Ringgold, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes Pine Forrest Park Sewer (phase 1) to install public sewer to a mobile home park. The residents currently use septic tanks. Public sewer service will replace the malfunctioning septic tanks and will benefit 111 people, of whom 108 or 97.3 are low- to moderate-income.
0422	Rockmart, City of CDBG Multi Activity Program	\$800,000	Phase 1-West Jackson St. Redevelopment-Proposes to acquire 3 private property parcels; 5 permanent relocations (4 tenants & 1 owner); demolition of up to 4 structures and clearance of 10 vacant lots; realignment of W. Jackson including new paving, curb & gutter, parking, sidewalks; water & sewer improvements, drainage improvements and a passive recreation area, playground and pedestrian bridge. A companion CHIP application provides for Phase 1 construction of new affordable rental units.
0383	Rockmart, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	West Jackson St. Redevelopment-Phase 1 construction of 15 new affordable rental units. Phase 2 (to be proposed in 2010) will provide for an additional 11 units. The companion CDBG application proposes to acquire 3 private parcels of property, 5 permanent relocations; demolition and clearance; realignment of W. Jackson including new paving, curb & gutter, parking, sidewalks, water & sewer improvements, drainage improvements and a passive recreation area & pedestrian bridge.
0390	Rome, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes citywide homeowner rehabilitation program that will assist eight senior homeowners with the rehabilitation of their homes. A total of 20 people will benefit, all of whom are low income.
0416	Sandersville, City of CDBG Multi Activity Program	\$800,000	MLK Drainage Improvements and Housing Rehab Program. The City proposes flood and drainage improvements to benefit 43 persons, 40 or 93% are low/mod income. CDBG funds will be used to rehabilitate one substandard house and reconstruct four substandard houses. Activities will benefit 7 persons of whom 100% are low/mod income.



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0433	Sandersville, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	14A-01 Rehabilitation of Private Properties The City of Sandersville plans to rehabilitate seven (7) owner-occupied, stick built homes to benefit approximately 18 low-moderate income persons.
0446	Siloam, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$331,900	Proposes construction of a new public well and water lines to alleviate contaminated water conditions and inadequate service, benefiting 413 people of whom 351 or 85% are low/mod income persons.
0532	Smithville, City of CDBG Housing Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes a city housing improvements program to provide owner-occupied rehabilitation assistance to three families and owner-occupied reconstruction assistance to six families, benefiting 26 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0374	Sumner, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$429,775	Proposes construction of a new well, benefiting 454 persons in 150 households. The need is for a 500 gpm deep well and chemical feed building to replace a collapsed 325 gpm well. The city is providing \$50,000 in matching support.
0380	Sylvester, City of CDBG Water/Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Project proposes improvements in the city's water distribution system and its sewer collection system, benefiting 503 persons.
0557	Talbot County CDBG Multi Activity Program	\$800,000	Proposes to correct serious drainage problems in a Talbot County neighborhood and to rehabilitate much of the substandard housing in the area. There are 26 households and 48 people benefiting from this project. Twenty-three of these households, containing 46 people, are low/mod income and represent 96% of the target area population.
0424	Tarrytown, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$445,734	Project proposes installation of 4,500 linear feet of water main; fire protection; well, tank and associated item improvements.
0451	Taylor County CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Taylor County proposes to install public sewer into the Goldson/Trice quarters target area to alleviate the low- and moderate-income residents of many septic tank problems. Currently none of residents have public sewer and are relying on faulty septic tanks.



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0367	Thomas County CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$294,463	Proposes street and drainage improvements in the Sugarwood Estates neighborhood in order to benefit 27 households with 69 residents, of whom 71% are low- to moderate-income.
0377	Thomasville, City of CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes paving and drainage improvements on five dirt streets in the Fairfax Street neighborhood. The project will benefit 83 residents. The city will rebuild existing water and sewer infrastructure. Matching support for this project totals \$622,098.
0485	Thomasville, City of CHIP Revitalization Area Strategy (CHIP)	\$200,000	Proposes housing rehabilitation assistance program of five homeowners in the City's proposed Victoria Place Revitalization Area. Fourteen people will benefit, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0417	Thomson, City of CDBG Multi Activity Program	\$800,000	Proposes to rehabilitate six owner-occupied housing units benefiting 12 low/mod income persons. Sewer and flood/drainage infrastructure improvements are proposed and will benefit 102 persons, 99 or 97% are low- to moderate-income.
0511	Tift County CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes street and drainage improvements on approximately 1.12 miles of dirt road on Red Bird Road. One hundred twelve people will benefit, of whom 87 or 77.7 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens. The County will provide \$216,176 in matching support for the project.
0510	Tifton, City of CHIP Housing Improvements (CHIP)	\$300,000	Proposes to assist 20 home-buyers with down-payment assistance, benefiting 80 people, all of whom are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0438	Toccoa, City of CDBG Multi Activity Program	\$589,959	Trogdon Heritage District Revitalization Phase I. Reconstruct four (4) dilapidated private, owner-occupied structures along West Spring and Avon Street. Ten People, 100 percent of whom are low income, will benefit from housing activities. Sidewalk and lighting improvements are also proposed along the northern portion of these streets, which will benefit 94 people, 75 (80%) qualify as low or moderate income.
0413	Union Point, City of CDBG Water Improvements	\$500,000	The City of Union Point proposes to provide much needed water improvements to a low- to moderate-income target area. The target area is comprised of 303 citizens of whom 272 or 90% are low- to moderate-income citizens.



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0506	Uvalda, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$485,000	The City of Uvalda proposes a new bar screen, replacement of a dilapidated baffle curtain, and replacement of inadequate fencing at its wastewater treatment facility. This project will benefit the entire City of Uvalda. There are 507 people residing in Uvalda and of these, 396 or 78% are low- to moderate- income.
0516	Varnell, City of CDBG Senior Center	\$500,000	The City of Varnell proposes to rehabilitate and construct an addition to the historic Varnell House for use as a senior citizens center. This project will benefit 77 low- and moderate-income senior citizens who live in North Whitfield County.
0398	Warrenton, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes to rehabilitate failing sewer lines in a low-to-moderate-income target area. The improvements will serve 147 people, of whom 142 or 97 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0435	Woodland, City of CDBG Drainage/Streets Improvements	\$295,753	Proposes street and drainage improvements in the eastern portion of the city, an area including 44 households. Serious drainage problems will be corrected, benefiting 123 people, of whom 119 or 97 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
0418	Wrens, City of CDBG Sewer Improvements	\$500,000	Proposes rehabilitation of the sewer collection system in a target area to eliminate sewer backups into homes and yards, benefitting 172 people, of whom 152 or 88 percent are low- to moderate-income citizens.
